At the age of 15 Jones dropped out of school and joined a Detroit street gang where over the next six years he would lose two of his cousins in gang confrontations.

Eventually he would leave gang life and struggle through a number of menial jobs before pursuing his dream of becoming a broadcaster at the age of 30.

Four years later Jones graduated from Seneca College with honours in the field of Broadcast Journalism, two literary scholarships and the Board of Governor's Award.

He is now the host of the Spider's Web on CFRB radio.

Most recently he has "Boxing voted

and Commentator Emcee of the Year" by the board of governors for the World Boxing Federation.

According to fair coordinator Jaime Balak. Jones was selected for this year's event not only for his inspiring story, but for his ability to capture the interest of students.

It is hoped that having such a popular speaker will also draw both the general public and students alike to the more than 50 exhibits representing businesses, eduinstitutions, cational professional associations and government.

"So many people are asking me about our speaker. . . I think that having one really popular aspect of the fair compliments the other parts," said Balak.
